

RIVER WANDLE WEIR REMOVAL 2016

The development of a new nature reserve to support aquatic life alongside the development of a more easily navigable waterway for small boats and pleasure craft were key deliverables behind the removal of a tidal weir in the mouth of the River Wandle on behalf of Wandsworth Council and Thames Water.

The project, in a highly built up area with a low bridge, was part of a wider scheme to improve water quality and restore lost wildlife habitats following the impact of the Thames Tideway Tunnel.

Project Delivery

- To protect river assets we strengthened and monitored the river wall - dating from 1861
- 400,000m³ of silt that had built up over 25 years was removed
- Careful testing confirmed that over 85% of the dredged material could go to non-hazardous landfill at a local site in Rainham
- Introducing the use of stop logs increased the working window from 2 to 10 hours. This was because we could maintain inundation despite tidal influence
- The nature reserve of approximately one hectare was established in the mouth of the Wandle Delta
- The wildlife habitat is designed to become a spawning area and nursery for young fish
- Community engagement was important and Land & Water ensured plenty of signs with links to social media for updates, community site visits and press involvement.

The project was also backed by The Environment Agency, the Marine Management Organisation and the Port of London Authority.
